Mrs Wright Writes!

Brrrr the weather has definitely changed and has a real Autumnal feel to it now! Please can you ensure your child is warmly dressed for school as we have to have more ventilation at the moment. We have some warm, cosy fleeces as part of our school uniform and I am wearing mine today! An extra layer underneath such as a vest, t shirt under the school shirt will help as the weather changes as will ensuring they have their school jumpers or cardigans. Shoes should be dark colours and appropriate for school. Smart boots are fine but again need to be suitable for school, no soft boots that let in water and in dark colours please. We have a lot of children in trainers which are not suitable for children's feet all day. The majority of our children are all in school uniform – thankyou. It does help them concentrate on their learning and feel part of the school community.

Thank you so much for wearing your face masks in the school grounds. The majority of our parents are now following this which helps to keep everybody safe.

We have had a number of suspected cases in our school but so far no positive cases. It could happen and other schools are reporting positive cases. I just want to remind you of our procedure if there is a positive case. We will contact you with a text message to notify you that there has been a positive case reported in your child's class bubble. This could be on a weekend. The whole class bubble will then need to isolate for fourteen days in case anybody else in that bubble goes on to develop symptoms. Their family and siblings only need to isolate if they are the ones with the positive case or symptoms. If your child's class bubble is isolating, then the whole bubble must stay off for fourteen days even if your child then tests negative in that bubble. This is because there has been a positive case and symptoms could develop within the two weeks. Normally a negative test result allows you to return to school. We have sent out charts which will help you with this and are always here to help if you need clarification. The children have been so engaged with their learning this week and I have observed some excellent learning across the whole school. The classrooms may look a little different but they are already full of the children's work. I will ask the teachers to parent hub you some pictures so you can see. I am always proud of the environment our children have at our school which supports and celebrates their learning. Thank you for ensuring your children are not coming to school too early but they are on time. We have all been really impressed with how sensibly the children are entering and leaving the school site and walking around to their class. The outside gates will be closing at 9.05am next week. Children should be in school between 8.45am and 8.55am. Children can still enter via the classroom doors until the outside gates are locked at 9.05am.

Please can I ask you all to ensure the children have everything they need for their school day? The office have had a steady stream of parents all day dropping off lunch boxes, P.E. kits etc. We are running the office as a virtual office at the moment to keep everybody safe. If things are dropped off all day it involves the office staff having to sanitise their hands constantly, take things to class bubbles at the doors (so the teacher then is interrupted teaching) and sanitise the phone etc as well as interrupting their work.
