## Late Collection of Children

We have given new guidance from the Local Authority regarding late collection of children. We wanted to make you aware of the update which will be on our website soon:

If a child is not collected by a parent/carer after the school day or approved activity, the Headteacher or Designated Safeguarding Lead will be notified. Every effort will then be made to contact the parent/carer, or failing that, the emergency contact.

From 15 minutes after collection time the child will be placed in our Wrap Around Care and parents may be charged for the session, at our discretion.

In the case of a pupil not being collected and the parent/carer not responding to calls made within 1 hour of the usual collection time, the school will ring Children's Social Care for further advice.

### Considerate Parking

Last week we received an email from Darwin Manor on Jeavons Lane asking us to remind parents about considerate parking. This week we have had residents from Jeavons Lane and the surrounding roads informing us that parents of Jeavons Wood pupils have been abusive to them, as well as parking inconsiderately. This is completely unacceptable behaviour and we want to remind you again to be considerate of where you park and how you treat other people.

The entrance to Darwin Manor is frequently used for medical access, and Jeavons Lane is too narrow for parking on both sides of the road. We must always make sure there is enough space for emergency vehicles to get through.

Please use alternative parking at The Hub, Church Car Park or Cricket Pavilion and allow enough time in the mornings to park considerately and safely. Thank you.
