



Personal, Social, Health Education (PSHE) at Jeavons Wood

Intent:

At Jeavons Wood Primary School, our aim is to provide a nurturing and inclusive learning environment where every child is encouraged to reach their full potential. We celebrate individual achievements and foster a culture of respect, responsibility, and self-worth within a happy and caring atmosphere.

We recognise that each child is unique, and our PSHE curriculum is designed to support their personal development by promoting mutual respect, emotional resilience, and positive relationships. Through PSHE, children explore the diverse beliefs, values, and attitudes that shape individuals and societies. They develop a deeper understanding of themselves and the world around them, learning to express their feelings and opinions with confidence and empathy.

Our curriculum also supports the acquisition of British Values, helping children make sense of their experiences both in and beyond school. It encourages them to value themselves, respect others, appreciate diversity, and grow into informed, responsible citizens.

Implementation:

PSHE at Jeavons Wood Primary School is embedded across the curriculum and forms a vital part of our whole-school ethos. It is taught explicitly in weekly lessons from Foundation Stage through to Year 6, and reinforced through cross-curricular links with subjects such as RE, Science, and Computing.

We provide a broad and balanced PSHE curriculum that equips children with the knowledge, language, and skills to navigate a wide range of social, moral, cultural, and behavioural issues. Our approach ensures that children can apply their learning in real-life contexts, both within school and in the wider community.

Key features of our implementation include:

- Weekly PSHE lessons as a non-negotiable part of the timetable
- Integration of British Values and SMSC (Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development) across all key stages
- Whole-school, Key Stage, and class assemblies that reinforce PSHE themes and values
- A progressive scheme of work that builds on key concepts year by year
- Opportunities for pupil voice and leadership through roles such as School Council and Peer Mediators

Through this holistic approach, PSHE becomes a living part of our school culture, shaping how children learn, interact, and grow.
