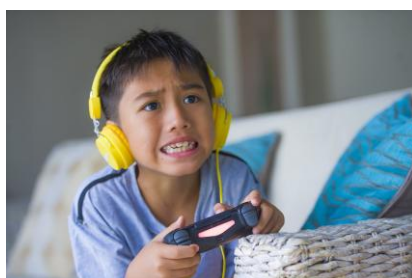
Online Safety

Big question: How do I keep safe online?

British Values Link: Rule of Law
 (Knowing and following the rules, being fair and keeping everyone safe)

National curriculum specification (KS1)

- Use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about content or contact on the internet or other online technologies.



In this unit, the children will:

- Recognise that there may be people online who make someone feel sad, embarrassed or upset.
- Give examples of when to ask permission to do something online and explain why this is important.
- Recognise that information can stay online and could be copied.
- Describe how to behave online in ways that do not upset others and give examples.
- Understand that work created by others does not belong to them, even if they save a copy.

Key vocabulary:

“Stop, think, talk to an adult”	Phrase to repeat throughout the unit. If what you see or hear online makes your tummy feel funny, follow these steps.
Online	Online means using a computer, tablet, or phone to connect to the internet. It's like visiting a big library or playground where you can find information, play games, and talk to friends.
Offline	Offline means not using the internet. It's like when you're playing with your toys, reading a book, or drawing a picture without using a computer, tablet, or phone.
Respect	This means being kind and caring to others. It's like listening when someone is talking, sharing your toys, and saying please and thank you.
Permission	This means asking someone if it's okay to do something and waiting for them to say yes. For example, you ask your parents if you can play outside, and they say yes.

Trusted adult	This is a grown-up who takes care of you and keeps you safe. It can be your parents, teachers, or other family members. You can talk to them if you need help or have a question.
