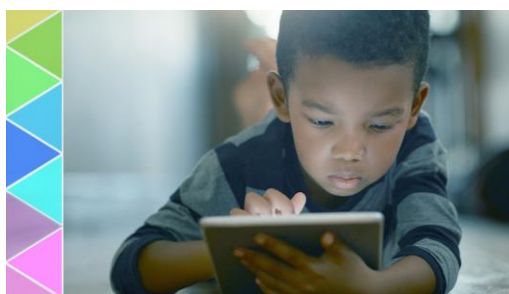
Big question: How does my iPad help me learn in Year 2?

be introduced to pages and numbers.


fact check information by browsing child-friendly search engines.

Key vocabulary:

Parts of an iPad	Home button, volume button, front camera, microphone, charging cable, lock button.
Seesaw specific vocabulary	Seesaw, journal, add response, activity, copy and edit, messages, comment, like, mic, voice, camera, video, label, drawing tools, check, upload.
Screenshot	An image of the device's screen.
Speech dictation	Turning audio in writing.
Zoom in	Moving the screen in to make an item bigger.
Zoom out	Moving the screen out to make an item full size or smaller.
Web browser	A search engine to access the world wide web. In Year 2, we search the web through child-friendly search engines.
Airdrop	Using wi-fi and Bluetooth to share an item with another apple device.
